

Study Suggestions:

1. Always do a *chapter preview*. Be familiar with the material before the teacher lectures.
2. Read all *questions* ahead of time so you can anticipate what you will be expected to know from the chapter.
3. Pay special attention to any *summary* type information that may be in the chapter.
3. Use *Cornell notes*.
4. Each night *rewrite* your notes from the lecture that day. Add things that you remember. If you wait too long the information will be "cold."
5. *Reread* notes from previous lectures often.
6. *Read* the chapter in *small amounts*. Try to anticipate what the teacher will talk about and read that information before the lectures. Then read the sections that were covered in the lecture.
7. *Power outline* the paragraphs that are relevant.
8. Make *flash cards* on the material (study them.)
9. Write out *definitions* of words emphasized by teacher. You must be able to use the words of the subject.
10. Utilize *active learning* in studying and reviewing the information.
11. *Explain* or teach someone else.
 1. If you study with a friend be sure you are really studying.
 2. Repetition, doing thing over and over helps them stay in your brain.
14. Remember the following information about learning:

Active learning is more affective than **passive** learning
Learning small amounts over a long time is better than learning large amounts in a short period of time.

Few people have unlimited time! You need to have good time management skills. Using your time efficiently is infinitely better than poor study habits.
